On January 13, 2017, Montana-Dakota Utilities Company ("MDU") filed a proposed natural gas conservation portfolio for program years 2017 through 2019 ("Proposal") with the Montana Public Service Commission ("Commission"). MDU currently offers incentives for residential and commercial high efficiency replacement furnaces, residential thermostats, residential high efficiency boilers, residential hot water heaters, residential energy assessments, and other efficiency projects completed by commercial and industrial customers.

From 2017 through 2019, MDU proposes to modify the residential programmable thermostat incentive program and discontinue the residential hot water heater replacement program. The proposed Tier 1 Residential Programmable Thermostats program decreases the existing customer incentive from \$20 down to \$15 for the purchase and installation of a programmable thermostat, and the proposed Tier 2 Residential Wi-Fi Connected Thermostats program is a new program giving customers an incentive of \$60 for the purchase and installation of a Wi-Fi connected, communicating thermostat that allows the customer access to the set points and schedules with a mobile smart device. Proposal at 2-3. MDU proposes to discontinue its Residential Hot Water Heaters - Replacement program alleging that changing energy efficiency standards have made it no longer cost effective. *Id.* at 3. MDU would keep its other programs unchanged. According to MDU, which provided the results of five Benefit/Cost tests, "each individual program as well as the total portfolio has a TRC [total resource cost] test result greater than 1.00 and is therefore, considered by Montana-Dakota and prior Commission decisions to be cost-effective." *Id.* at 6.

On February 8, 2017, the Commission issued a *Notice of Proposal and Opportunity to Comment*. In *Comments* filed on February 23, 2017, the Montana Consumer Counsel ("MCC") requested that the Commission "deny MDU's request to recover lost margin." On March 16, 2017, the Commission issued a data request asking MDU to clarify whether or not MDU is proposing to recover lost margins in the 2017-2019 program years, with a response due by March 28, 2017. On March 21, 2017, MDU responded stating it did not request recovery of lost margin as part of the Conservation Tracking Adjustment in this docket.

The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Title 69 of the Montana Code Annotated. A copy of the Proposal is available for inspection at the business offices of MDU, 400 North Fourth Street, Bismarck, North Dakota 58501; the Commission, 1701 Prospect Avenue, P.O. The State of Montana encourages efficient utility operation and efficient use of utility services. Mont. Code Ann. § 69-3-1202(1) (2015). To facilitate these goals, Montana-Dakota Utilities Company ("MDU") operates a portfolio of demand-side energy conservation programs that incentivize installation of high efficiency natural gas furnaces, boilers, water heaters, and programmable thermostats; encourage energy assessments; and include a custom energy conservation program to promote consumer ingenuity. During the previous year, 587 customers utilized various MDU portfolio programs to generate 4,962 dekatherms of annual energy savings and 90,450 dekatherms of lifetime energy savings. MDU can recover expenditures associated with these energy savings by requesting utility rate adjustments, which are tracked and approved annually by the Department of Public Service Regulation ("PSC"). If approved, MDU's Rate 90 Tariff will increase from \$0.013 to \$0.016 per dekatherm for the next twelve month period, resulting in an approximate \$0.02 monthly increase for a typical residential customer consuming 85 dekatherms of natural gas annually.
