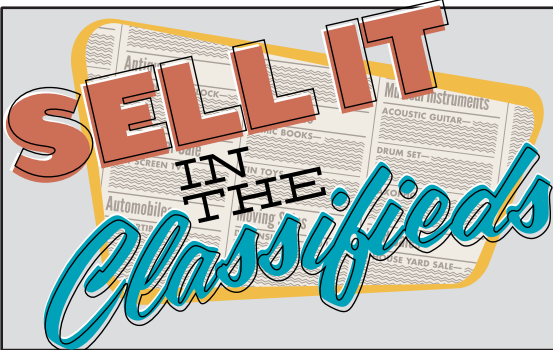

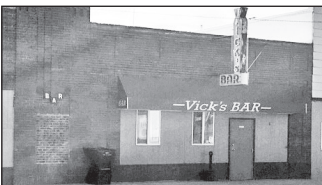

Montana-Dakota Utilities Company ("MDU") is permitted to recover its annual gas costs incurred in providing natural gas service to Montana customers. Those costs are tracked and recovered annually by MDU upon approval by the Montana Public Service Commission ("Commission").

On September 13, 2019, MDU filed with the Commission its annual application to adjust its gas cost tracking adjustment found within its Rate 88 Tariff. ("Application"). If approved, it would result in a \$0.016 per dk increase for residential and general service customers, and an increase of \$0.028 per dk for small and large interruptible service customers.

A copy of MDU's Application is available for inspection at the Commission's business offices, 1701 Prospect Avenue, P.O. Box 202601, Helena, Montana 59620-2601; and the Montana Consumer Counsel ("MCC"), 111 North Last Chance Gulch, Suite 1B, P.O. Box 201703, Helena, Montana 59620-1703, telephone (406) 444-2771. The MCC is available to represent the interests of the consuming public in this matter.

The Commission invites any interested person directly affected by MDU's Application to intervene. To intervene parties must file a petition to intervene with the Commission no later than October 10, 2019. Parties must submit: (1) an electronic petition to the PSC's website at <http://psc.mt.gov> ("EDDI, Customer Portal & E-Filing" icon); (2) physically deliver or mail the original petition to the PSC address stated above; (3) and a hard copy of the petition to the MCC, and to MDU's counsel, Mike Green, Crowley Fleck PLLP, 900 N. Last Chance Gulch, Suite 200, Helena, MT, 59601. The Commission will not post an e-filed document to its website until it receives the original from the petitioner.

The Commission also invites interested parties who do not wish to formally intervene to submit written public comments on the matter to the Commission address stated above, or through its web-based comment form at <http://psc.mt.gov> ("Comment on a Proceeding" under the "Documents & Proceedings" tab).

The Commission's jurisdiction over this matter is provided in Title 69, Chapter 3 of the Montana Code Annotated, and Title 38, Chapters 2 and 5 of the Montana Administrative Rules, and any prior orders of the Commission relevant to the issues presented.

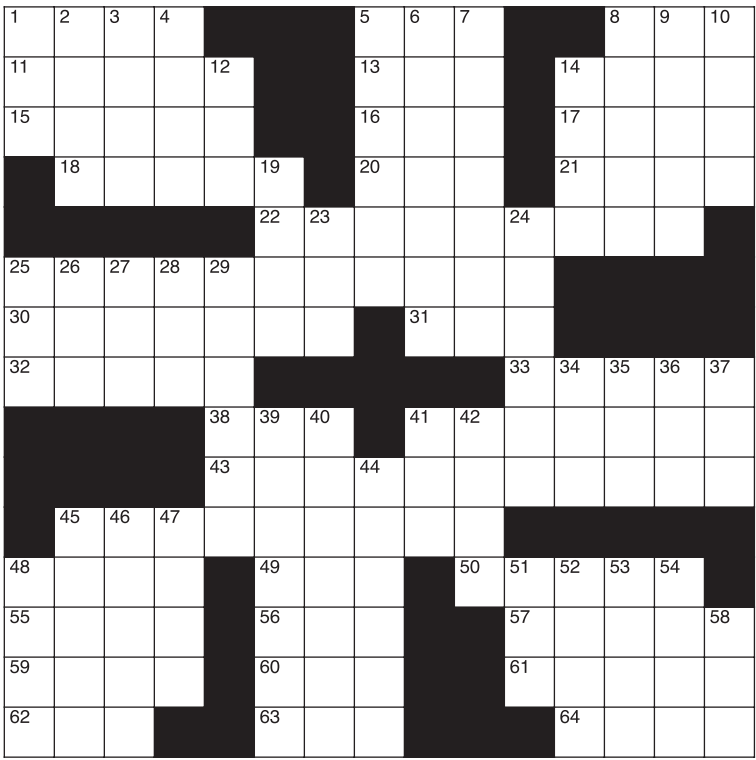

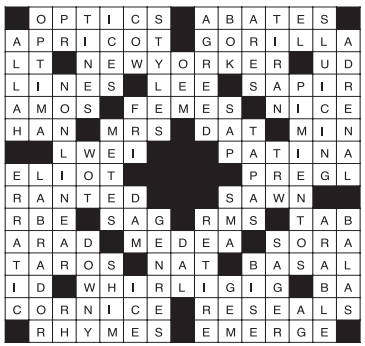

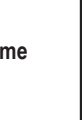
