

## LAW ENFORCEMENT

This information is taken from the log of calls received by the Valley County Law Enforcement Center and does not represent the entire activity of any one department.

For the week of June 12 to 18 there were 20 accidental calls, nine reports of loose cattle, eight motor vehicle stops, two reports of loose pets, two vehicle inspections, one building check and one warrant issued.

#### Monday, June 12

1432 – Caller wanted an emergency welfare check on her mother, stating that her mother's husband was seen driving around Glasgow and in front of her residence without the mother in the vehicle with him. She was very demanding to have someone sent right away and mentioned that she cannot check on her due to a restraining order.

1701 - Caller reported to a deputy that he has some juveniles at the Fort Peck Trout Pond with alcohol, one blew a zero while the others blew between .032 and .042.

2205 – A caller stated that he needed a welfare check on his wife who was in Pueblo, Colo. He believed that his wife was having a heart attack and wanted to see if someone could get to her.

2214 – Caller reported that she hit a deer near Nashua. She was driving a company vehicle and it sustained body damage as well as the logo came off. She reported that she could not find the deer's body but the guts were still on the road.

#### Tuesday, June 13

1200 – Caller reported that he accidentally spilled some cement on the roadway when the drum turned backwards unexpectedly and requested some help to get it all cleaned up.

1241 – Caller advised that he kicked a man out of his house last week, stating that he was helping this individual with getting him food, housing and a vehicle. He

stated that he kicked the man who then threatened his life, as he knew where the caller keeps the firearms in the house. The caller then got his gun and fired a shot in the air, causing him to be charged with aggravated assault. When the caller had returned home he found that the man who threatened him had stolen items from his home. Three hours later another caller called in to report a similar crime, his house being burglarized by the same perpetrator. He gave details stating that the perpetrator was with his girlfriend and provided a description of the vehicle. He wanted the sheriff's department to watch in case they came towards or through Valley County.

1839 - Caller reported a pickup that has been parked all day in one location, stating that no one has been seen anywhere near or inside the vehicle. A description of the pickup was provided.

1106 – Caller reported a scam caller for the Social Security Administration (SSA). They were trying to get her Medicare information and she had some fun with the scammer before hanging up. She called Great Falls SSA and they wanted her to make this report.

1244 – Caller reported that someone had keyed her vehicle the night before.
