WHITEWATER CREEK - BASIN 40K
ALL WATER USERS NEED TO READ THIS NOTICE
This second notice of issuance is being published because the Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation (DNRC) failed to provide correct notice when this Decree was originally issued.
By statute, each water user in this basin is entitled to proper notice when the Water Court issues a decree. Preparation and mailing of notices is the responsibility of the Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation. To ensure proper notice was given, the Water Court ordered the DNRC to include a copy of a Notice of Availability to each water user in this basin. In addition, the Water Court required the DNRC to state in writing that it had followed the Water Court's order.
Despite this Court's order, and the clear requirements of the statute, the DNRC failed to send a Notice of Availability to water users in this basin. In addition, the DNRC inaccurately represented that it had correctly mailed such notice.
The Montana Water Court has entered its Interlocutory Decree for Basin 40K and the Decree is now available for your review.

This Decree includes 64 water rights. These water rights were either not previously decreed by the Water Court or have issues that still need to be addressed. If you believe any claims in these Decrees do not reflect historical (before July 1, 1973) beneficial use, you should file an objection by January 29, 2024. Objections must be filed on the forms provided by the Water Court.
A request to extend the objection deadline must be filed by **January 29, 2024**. Any extension will be advertised once in this newspaper.
RIGHT TO APPEAL
If you do not participate in Water Court proceedings, your right to appeal an adverse decision is limited by Section 85-2-235, MCA. If changes were made to your abstract, you may challenge those changes by filing an objection. You may also address DNRC issue remarks by an objection. If there are changes and/or issue remarks on your abstract which are not resolved by an objection, these will be addressed and resolved by the Water Court.

FWP Fisheries Public Meetings Being Held In Glasgow and Havre

Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks Region 6 will host two informational meetings on several fish-related topics, including proposals for the 2024 Fishing Regulations, the Statewide Fisheries Management Plan, and the Fort Peck Management Plan.

The meetings will be held in Glasgow starting at 6 p.m. on Monday, Aug. 28, at the FWP headquarters Quonset room (1 Airport Road), and in Havre at 6 p.m. on Wednesday, Aug. 30, at the Best Western Great Northern Inn (1425 US Hwy 2).

The public comment period for fishing regulations will close on Sept. 18, and instructions on how to comment will be provided once regulations are made public. A comment period on the Statewide Fisheries Management Plan/EA will close Sept. 30. Fishing regulations will be on the Oct. 19 Fish and Wildlife Commission meeting agenda.

Sen. Tester and Rep. Rosendale Urge To Delay TSA Employee Screening Policy

On Aug. 17, Congressman Matt Rosendale (MT-02) sent a letter to TSA Administrator David Pekoske demanding his Agency retract their Airport Security Program National Amendment (TSA-NA-23-02) that requires airports across Montana to increase the physical screening of employees and install expensive explosive protection equipment with zero financial support.

“Aviation security screening and safety at our airports is a national priority; however, this amendment imposes unreasonable requirements on Montana airports which already contribute substantially to airspace security,” said Rep. Rosendale. “The unrealistic timeline provided by TSA forces airports in Montana, using limited revenue sources, to develop procedures and implement random screening of aviation workers by Sept. 25, 2023. Airports in Montana cannot be expected to train staff, develop guidelines, and administer such a program in such a short amount of time. I request that the TSA rescind this unfunded mandate immediately and take financial and administrative responsibility for the requirements of this amendment.”

On Aug. 18, U.S. Senator Jon Tester led a bipartisan letter alongside Senator John Hoeven (R-N.D.) urging the Biden Administration to also delay this implementation.

In their letter to TSA Administrator David Pekoske, Senators Tester and Hoeven stressed that while they share the agency's commitment to enhancing the safety and security of air travel, they have concerns that the new screening policy would place an undue burden on smaller airports in rural states.

"We have serious concerns about the National Amendment's implementation, effectiveness, and cost to operators in its current form. We are especially concerned about the National Amendment's impacts on smaller, rural airports like those located in our states. These airports are essential to travel nationwide and serve as critical parts of America's economic engine."

The Senators noted in their letter that the Senate Appropriations Committee previously expressed concern about the TSA policy and requested its implementation be delayed: “As the Senate Appropriations Committee noted in language in the fiscal year (FY) 2024 Homeland Security Appropriations bill, the National Amendment appears to be being implemented ‘in a manner that imposes undue burdens on airport operators.’ The Committee also expressed concern that the National Amendment ‘may place requirements on non-TSA security screeners that exceed their legal authority’ and that it is being ‘implemented prior to a thorough cost benefit analysis or risk assessment.’ Due to these serious concerns, the Committee urged TSA to delay implementation of the National Amendment for at least one year and to reassess the security benefits of the amendment as well as its ‘full financial and operational impacts’ on the airports impacted by these requirements.”

Tester and Hoenen concluded their letter by urging TSA to immediately delay implementation of the burdensome policy: "We request that TSA heed the concerns raised by Congress and airport operators regarding the National Amendment and immediately delay its implementation."
